




May is Older American's Month





History

- In 2005 the Johnson County Consortium on Successful Aging prepares the Successful Aging in Johnson County: A Market Analysis. Recommendations include:
- Encourage more "senior friendly" efforts by local governments, businesses and organizations.
- 2. Use follow-up studies (health and supportive services, transportation, housing, successful aging) to
 - a) Define specific needs of Johnson County seniors
 - b) Identify best practices and viable responses
 - c) Obtain stakeholder support to address needs.
- 3. Create independent, current and comprehensive information repository of programs/services/ polices.
- 4. Recruit professional staff to help implement recommendations.



HISTORY


- 2006, Planning Forums held with AARP CEO Bill Novelli
- 2007 Johnson County Board of Supervisors establishes Johnson County Livable Community



POLICY BOARD


- 2 3 representatives of Johnson County government, including one member of the Board of Supervisors
- At least 4 and up to 7 representatives of organizations or other governmental bodies working on issues of aging or livable communities in Johnson County
- At least 3 and up to 6 members that are residents of Johnson County and serve in an at-large capacity, with at least two members residing outside of the urbanized area

MISSION


To serve as a unifying structure that fosters effective collaboration, communication and education that will build and sustain a livable community for successful aging



VISION


- To help Johnson County become a more livable community where everyone can age successfully. Johnson County will be a livable community which has:

Which together facilitate personal independence and the engagement of residents in civic and social life.




Purpose

- Increase community dialogue on successful aging




KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS





SURVEY RESULTS

- November 2016 December 2016
- 144 respondents
- Reasons for visiting website: newsletter, activities and events, provider directory
- 90% found what they were looking for on the website
- 98% reported that information in the Connections newsletter is relevant
- Most valuable sections of the newsletter; Around the County section, health related updates, It's Your Call Legislative column




2011 Census Projections 65 and Older in Johnson County






BY THE NUMBERS

- In 2015 an estimated 15,002 people over the age of 65 lived in Johnson County (10.4% of the population)
- An estimated 34% increase in Johnson County residents
 65 and older in the last five years
- In 2015, 13,460 residents 65 and older received nearly \$20 million in Social Security benefits
- 2010 -2014, 4.7% of Johnson County residents 65 and up lived in poverty
- In 2014, 9% of seniors in the U.S. were food insecure (Feeding America)
